How to Reduce Doggy Stress During the Holidays

Finn McKool and I want to wish you all safe and happy holidays. There's so much to do to get ready — shopping, cooking, traveling, visiting family and friends — that it can be a really stressful time.

Our dogs can sense that something different is going on, and they can get just as stressed out. They may show it with behavioral problems, like chewing a shoe (or ornaments) or peeing on the rug. Here are some ways you can help them survive the season without the stress:

- **Maintain business as usual.** Stick to your routine as much as possible. Keep his walk and feeding schedule the same.
- **Exercise.** It's good for both of you, but it really reduces anxiety in your pup. If it's a nice day, try to make it to the dog park if even for a short time.
- Make a game of it. Give your dog part of his food in a puzzle, such as a Kong treat holder. This is a good brain stimulant, as well as a distraction. You could also hide little treats around the house or go with Finn's favorite: the Interactive IQ Treat Ball.
- **Give him Mom or Dad time.** When you're so busy, your dog can feel left out. Just make a little extra time for cuddling or much-needed attention.
- Day care does wonders. Treat your dog to a day of day care! It's extra playtime for him and a free day for you. North Shore Dog and Petsmart both offer the service.

We're lucky the cold hasn't hit us yet, but when you're in the Northeast you know it's just a matter of time. Get out the doggy sweaters and boots — good luck with that — and get ready for the cold with these stay-safe suggestions.

Limit exposure to the cold. If your dog spends a good amount of time in your fenced-in yard, try to put up some kind of sheltered area (preferably heated) with dry bedding.

Check your thermostat. Dogs get cold, too. If your pup's bed is near a drafty window, move it to a warmer spot. You might consider doggy pajamas — especially if your dog is very small or has a thin coat (of fur, that is).

Anti-freeze is a no-no. It is for your dog, at least. It's extremely toxic (are you listening, Magnet?) and should be kept well out of their reach. Make sure to wipe up any spills or leaks immediately.

May I see your ID? Hopefully, your dog will never manage to escape from your yard or pull out of its leash. Take precautions by making sure his ID tag is updated and he is microchipped.

Scour your yard. Survey your yard for any potentially dangerous objects that could be hiding under piles of leaves or lurking. Look for broken glass, excessive pine needles, sharp sticks, chicken bones or food scraps.
